- The loud music from the neighbors' party kept the whole family **awake** all night. (鄰居派對的音樂聲太吵，讓這家人整夜睡不著。)

- The **distance** between the eastern end of Russia and the western one is about ten thousand kilometers. (俄羅斯東西兩端的距離大約是一萬公里。)
- In large cities in Taiwan, it is common to find more than one restaurant within walking **distance** of one's home. (臺灣的大城市裡常常可以在住家步行可及的距離內找到一家以上的餐廳。)

14. **journey** [ˈdʒɜːnɪ] *n. [C]* 旅行③

- After high school, the two best friends plan to go on a **journey** around the world. (高中畢業後，這兩位最要好的朋友計畫要去環遊世界。)

- Mr. Yang is an **expert** in math. I'm glad to have him as my tutor. (楊先生是一位數學專家，我很高興有他當我的家教。)

- Some animals are able to **survive** from season to season by changing the color of their fur. (有些動物靠著改變體毛的顏色，安然度過不同季節。)
- Fortunately, all 103 passengers **survived** the plane crash. (幸運地，機上 103 名乘客都倖免於這場空難。)

- Mozart **accomplished** more before the age of twenty. (莫札特在 20 歲前成就了很多事蹟。)

6. **disease** [dɪ`ziz] *n. [U, C]* 疾病③

- Washing your hands often is a good way to stop the spread of **disease**. (常洗手是預防疾病傳染的好方法。)
- Lynn's grandmother is suffering from a serious heart **disease**, so she is staying in a hospital. (Lynn 的祖母罹患嚴重的心臟病，現正住院中。)

- Janice was given a **reward** of \$2,000 for informing the police of the address of the man

<p>they were looking for. (Janice 告知警方他們追緝中的男子的地址，因此獲贈 2,000 元的賞金。)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Larry feels satisfied when he helps strangers, even if there is no reward. (Larry 覺得幫助陌生人很有滿足感，就算沒有報酬也無妨。)</li> </ul>
